Growing Conditions



We certainly have some unique growing conditions in Wyoming, especially here in Cheyenne. Cheyenne sits on a high, dry plain, in-between two downward slopes; one from the foothills, of what are called the "Southern Rockies" to the Eastern Bluffs; These two opposing landscapes drive the wind in an almost horizontal line from Canada, straight down the Great Plains, past Cheyenne and over the slope into Colorado. It's very interesting though that once you cross the Wyoming State line, the winds are considerably less intrusive; and the drop in elevation and the growing conditions are considerably better, as you follow the natural trough, down into the "Great Basin". We challenge the number 1 position in the nation for hail; but, we are also very dry, with an annual rain fall of most deserts, at 15 inches per year. So; What's the elevation have to do with anything? Well, at higher elevations the climate changes drastically, it creates a lower hardiness zone for each 1,000' rise in elevation. We've been designated a Zone 4a, by the National Arbor Day Foundation, and the USDA shows Cheyenne as a Zone 5b; but they base their zone information on average minimum temperatures and don't calculate for altitude, rainfall or the wind. We should actually grow plants that are in Zone 3, maybe some zone 4, for greater success. Also, Cheyenne has difficult soils, many areas are hard clay, high alkaline soils, others are a prairie loam; both creating their own problems. And last but not least is our short growing season; we only have an average of 90 frost-free days a year. So... how do we overcome these harsh growing conditions? Well, the way Gardeners do it here in Cheyenne is, we modify our growing climate. How do you do that? We add compost and soil amendments to create a better growing structure; we add drip irrigation systems and mulches to aid in soil moisture retention; and we create protective barriers from the wind and critters that might enjoy your garden more than you do. So; Yes there are challenges to growing gardens in Wyoming, but it CAN be done. Let's work together to create sustainable- healthful and tasty landscapes for your yard and I'll help you do it! All it takes is some elbow grease, some Patience and some Realistic Expectations.
